how it works:

Step 1: We chat via email about inspiration and what you are looking for. Feel free to share pictures of your space, color inspiration, and past artwork of mine that you like.

Step 2: You choose your size & the type of medium. Commissions are available on yupo paper (a special non-porous paper for alcohol inks) or 1.5" deep gallery wrapped canvas. All commissions are painted with professional quality acrylic paint and/or alcohol inks depending on the style of painting you are requesting.

Step 3: I will send an invoice for a non-refundable 50% deposit. This is paid up front and is used to cover the cost of supplies and labor. You will pay the remaining 50% once you approve the final piece. For larger pieces, payment plans can be arranged.

Step 4: We decide on a color palette and overall vision for the artwork. Choose intentions that you'd like me to infuse into the painting with Reiki. This creation is designed to bring positive energy to your space!

Step 5: Once approved, I will order supplies and begin on the final piece. You will receive regular updates where you can provide feedback and make tweaks to the composition and color.

Step 6: Once you are in LOVE with your artwork, I will send an invoice for the remaining 50% + shipping cost (if needed).

Step 7: After the invoice is paid, I will varnish your artwork to protect it. Then I will carefully package and deliver or ship your painting! You will receive tracking information once it is shipped.
